

1 INTRODUCTION

Council, working with the community, has developed the Wollongong Cycling Strategy 2030. This document aims to increase bike riding participation. The strategy guides our planning for events, education campaigns as well as reviewing and implementing a range of cycling infrastructure priorities. Further, Wollongong being awarded hosting of the 2022UCI Road World Championships has added to our focus of upgrading local cycling infrastructure.

2 OBJECTIVES

The objective of this group is to provide Council with detailed technical feedback in the planning of key pieces of cycling related infrastructure. The areas Council may seek advice on include;

- development of the Cringila Hills Recreation and Mountain Bike Park as a cycling hub.
- development of a dedicated multi-use criterium course.
- development of local BMX and pump tracks
- development of learn to ride facilities
- development of cycling network priorities
- providing feedback on installation of complimentary cycling infrastructure such as bike racks storage and water stations

As well as other cycling related projects that may arise.

3 MEMBERSHIP/REPRESENTATION

- Director Infrastructure and Works or delegate
- Up to six community representatives with significant experience in cycling either at a competitive, coaching or infrastructure planning level. This should include representation from the peak cycling bodies locally, for example Illawarra Cycle Club, Illawarra Mountain Bike Alliance, and I-Bug.
- Walking, Cycling and Mobility Reference Group representative
- AusCycling Representative
- Ex Officio
- Senior Traffic Engineer

Community representative nominations to be advertised and members to be appointed by merit.

4 CONDUCT OF ADVISORY GROUP

- Term of appointment for community representatives to be two years
- The group may seek any relevant external or internal expertise as it sees appropriate to any matter before it
- A quorum will consist of half the group membership, plus one
- The group to meet at least quarterly or as required

5 DELEGATION

The group will act in an advisory role to Council.

6 ACCOUNTABILITY

Group members will be required to act within Council's Code of Conduct.
