
The Wollongong City Council Annual Report Snapshot shows highlights and Council achievements from the 2022-2023 financial year.

Who we are

Located 80 kilometres south of Sydney, Wollongong covers 714 square kilometres. It is a narrow area the Royal National Park is to the north, Lake Illawarra to the south, the Pacific Ocean to the east and the Illawarra escarpment to the west. The name Wollongong comes from the Aboriginal word woolyungah meaning five islands.

The Wollongong Local Government Area (LGA) is divided into three wards with four Councillors elected to represent each ward. The Lord Mayor is elected by all voters and represents the entire Wollongong LGA.

Wollongong is the fourth largest city in New South Wales and 11th largest city in Australia by population.



Overview

Throughout the year, we have continued delivering for our community. We focused on moving past the COVID-19 pandemic and working through difficult weather. We faced increasing prices for goods and services and had shortages of materials and labour in some areas.

Despite these challenges, the year has had many highlights where we delivered quality services and managed assets worth \$6.4 billion for our community.





Objectives

The region's industry base continues to diversify and local employment opportunities increase.

Wollongong is established as the regional capital of the Illawarra-Shoalhaven. We are leaders in innovation and sustainable research and development of new industries.

Achievements

Latest job numbers saw 64% of the Local Government Area-wide 10,500 jobs target (2027-2028) achieved this year, resulting in 6,370 additional jobs since 2019. Highlight for Crown Street Mall included improved signs and seating in Globe Lane. Christmas 2022 activities and Wander Wollongong Art. Council helped 76 new business and investment enquiries throughout the 2022-2023 year. Three new cabins built at Windang Tourist Park in partnership with TAFE. The revised Wollongong CBD Night time Economy Policy was approved. Invest Wollongong released the new Investment Prospectus 2023. It shows key sectors such as technology, clean energy and advanced manufacturing. Hosted a "Doing Business with Council Procurement showcase" in May. 180 businesses attended.

GOAL 3 | WOLLONGONG IS A CREATIVE, VIBRANT CITY

Community have access to the arts, and participation in events and festivals is increased.

Achievements


The 2022 UCI Road World Championships – Wollongong NSW was held from 18 to 25 September 2022 and was the largest cycling event to be held in NSW since the 2000 Olympics. The Illawarra Performing Arts Centre was upgraded. This including fixing the foyers and replacing the roof. There was upgrades to accessibility and lighting and a new airconditing system. The Illawarra Escarpment Mountain Bike Strategy was finalised. Coomaditchie: The Art of Place exhibition held. This celebrated 30 years of Coomaditchie United Aboriginal Corporation. Approved Council's Public Art Strategy 2022-2032. Council's two largest community events, New Year's Eve and Australia Day, were held. The 'Sculpture in the Garden' exhibition held in March and April 2023 attracted over 40,000 visitors.

There is an increase in the physical and mental health and wellbeing of our community.


Our community participation in recreation and lifestyle activities increases. Residents have improved access to a range of affordable housing options. Suburbs and places are liveable and safe.
