Wollongong City Council Infrastructure, Strategy and Planning Division Transport and Stormwater

The City of Wollongong Traffic Committee is not a Committee of Wollongong City Council however a Technical Committee of the Roads & Maritime Services (RMS). The Committee operates under the authority conferred to Council by the RMS under the Transport Administration Act 1988.

Council has been delegated certain powers, from the RMS, with regard to traffic matters upon its local roads. A condition of this delegation is that Council must take into account the Traffic Committee recommendations.

There are four permanent members of the Traffic Committee, each of whom has a single vote only.

- The members are representatives of the NSW Police Force, the Roads & Maritime Services, the Local State Member of Parliament (for the location of the issue to be voted upon), and a representative of Wollongong City Council.
- If the RMS or NSW Police Force disagrees with any Traffic Committee recommendation, or Council's resolution on any Traffic Committee recommendation, that member may lodge an appeal with the Regional Traffic Committee for determination. The appeal must be lodged in writing within 14 days of Council's resolution. Any action relative to any issue under appeal must cease until the matter is determined. The Regional Traffic Committee is chaired by an independent chairperson and submissions and representations are welcomed from all interested parties.

Council can only recommend that:

- 1 The Traffic Committee recommendation be adopted.
- 2 The Traffic Committee recommendation not be adopted.
- 3 The Traffic Committee reconsider this issue.

GENERAL BUSINESS

¹ WOONONA

Pitman Lane – Request for Parking Restrictions

Background:

Residents of Pitman Lane have requested that Council consider parking restrictions within the lane due to instances of parked vehicles blocking access to a number of driveways off the lane. As the lane is narrow parking restrictions may assist in ensuring accesses are not blocked.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Install 'No Stopping' Restrictions for the length of Pitman Lane, Woonona on both sides, by way of continuous yellow lines.

² CORRIMAL

Wilga Street - Corrimal Public School Crossing

Background:

A resident has contacted Council with concerns regarding safety and signage at this section of Wilga Street. There is an existing 'No Stopping' sign located close to the kerbside blister of the children's crossing, and there have been instances of vehicles parked across the driveways to Nos 68 and 70 Wilga Street. (Drawing 5151_C01_A)

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Relocate the existing 'No Stopping' sign on the southern side of the children's crossing 10metres further to the south in Wilga Street, Corrimal, including an additional length of unbroken yellow line.

³ MOUNT KEIRA

Intersection of Yates Avenue and Mount Keira Road - Traffic Safety Concerns

Background:

The intersection of Yates Avenue and Mount Keira Road is located on a significant hillside for both streets and at present there is no intersection control other than the standard T junction rules. Council has received a request to improve sight distance for vehicles entering Mount Keira Road by installing parking restrictions in Mount Keira Road on the approach to Yates Avenue.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Install:

- I. Double barrier centrelines in Yates Avenue for a distance of 10 metres from the kerb-line in Mount Keira Road.
- II. A broken hold line on the kerb-line across Yates Avenue and a Give Way Sign.
- III. 'No Stopping' restrictions by way of continuous yellow lines adjacent to the intersection for a distance of 15 metres on the southern side of Mount Keira Road, immediately to the east of Yates Avenue, and for a distance of 10 m on both sides of Yates Avenue.

⁴ CONISTON

Bridge Street - Parking Concerns in the vicinity of Warrigal Aged Care Facility (91 Bridge Street)

Background:

The roadway to the west of the divided carriage way of Bridge Street is narrow with double centrelines marked and it is too narrow for parking to be permitted. While parked cars in this area have the effect of slowing traffic speeds, they also require most vehicles to cross the centreline when negotiating the curve at this location. Therefore, it is appropriate to consult with residents regarding a proposal to install 'No Stopping' signs around the curve in Bridge Street.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Install 'No Stopping' restrictions by way of continuous yellow lines around the curve in Bridge Street, Coniston, between the existing 'No Parking' sign (ref. 106284) and the driveway at 103 Bridge Street and between the driveways at 96 and 102 Bridge Street.

⁵ CRINGILA

Lake Avenue – Timed Parking

Background:

Council has received a request for timed parking on the eastern side of Lake Avenue between Newcastle and Steel Streets, Cringila. At present the timed parking finishes north of Newcastle Street and it is appropriate to extend the 1P timed parking as requested. It will allow reasonable parking turn over for the retail business on the corner of Steel Street and Lake Avenue.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Install 1P Parking restrictions on the eastern side of Lake Avenue, between Newcastle and Steel Streets to be timed 8.30 am to 6pm Monday – Friday and 8.30am to 12.30pm Saturdays.

⁶ OTFORD

Station Road – Coastal Classic Trail Run – Saturday 3rd September 2016

Background:

The Coast Classic Trail Run has been held for the past six years to raise funds for the improvement of the Coast Track in the Royal National Park. The event commences from Otford Primary School, Station Road, and proceeding along Beaumont Road, Fanshawe Road and Lady Wakehurst Drive. It is proposed to close Station Road from 6am to 10.30am on Saturday 3rd September 2016.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

The submitted Traffic Management Plans (Attachment 2) be approved subject to Council's Standard Conditions for Road Closures. (Attachment 1).

⁷ WOLLONGONG

Bravo Challenge – 2 Day Event - Saturday 3rd and Sunday 4th September 2016

Background:

The organisers of the Bravo Challenge have proposed a 2 day event for 2016.

Day 1 will be held on Mount Keira Road between Gipps Road and Queen Elizabeth Drive, utilising the Summit Park as well. Queen Elizabeth Drive will remain open and the event involves a road closure of Mount Keira Road from 6am to 4pm. The arrangements are similar to 2015 where the organisers agreed that should emergency access be required or Mount Keira Road be necessary as a detour for light traffic from Mount Ousley and Picton Roads, that the event would be suspended.

Day 2 will be held in Lang Park, Stuart Park and the reserve off Endeavour Drive where traffic controls are required on Cliff Road and Marine Drive to permit participants to cross safely. The traffic controls are required from 9am to 4pm.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

The proposed road closure and regulation of traffic be approved subject to the submitted traffic management plans (Attachment 3) and Council's Standard Conditions for Road Closures. (Attachment 1)

LATE ITEM – REGULATION OF TRAFFIC

⁸ WOLLONGONG

Staff Street – Installation of Tower Crane.

Background:

Subsequent to the Meeting, a developer has requested the road closure of the eastern section of Staff Street, Wollongong between Allan and Crown Streets from 6am to 6pm on Wednesday 27th July, with alternate days being 28th and 29th July. The road network will not be significantly affected as the inbound 24 bus route uses the western section of Staff Street and vehicles entering from Crown Street to the affected section of Staff Street are limited to a left turn only, as there is a right turn ban for eastbound traffic on Crown Street.

The contractor for traffic controls will permit residents access as required during the closure. The plans have been circulated to the NSW Police and NSW Roads & Maritime Services representatives and the proposed closure is supported unanimously.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

The proposed road closure and regulation of traffic for one of the 3 days 27 to 29 July 2016 weather permitting, be approved subject to the submitted traffic management plan (Attachment 4), the provision of a 'Road Closed Ahead' sign for westbound traffic on Crown Street and Council's Standard Conditions for Road Closures. (Attachment 1)

⁹ FAIRY MEADOW

Princes Highway - Adjustments to Bus Zone

Background:

Council has prepared plans to adjust the Bus Zone at 186 Princes Highway, Fairy Meadow as part of a reconstruction of the facility.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Plan 5680_C01_2 be approved. (Attachment 5)

¹⁰ WOLLONGONG

Gipps and Kembla Streets – Roundabout

Background:

Council has prepared plans for a roundabout at the intersection of Gipps and Kembla Street.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Plan 5821 be approved (Attachment 6), subject to the inclusion of:

- I. No Left Turn signs for traffic on the roundabout either side of the access point from the eastbound section of Gipps Street.
- II. A second pavement arrow on the eastbound section Gipps Street on the approach to the roundabout.
- ¹¹ DAPTO

Mulda Street – Shared Path

Background:

Council has prepared plans to extend the Shared Path in Mulda Street, Dapto which involves signage to indicate the new section of shared path and signs to facilitate cyclists crossing to narrow lanes.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Plan 5686_C01-C03 be approved. (Attachment 7)



INFORMAL

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An informal discussion was held regarding bus services to be provided for visiting cruise ships, the first of which is to arrive on Sunday 28th October 2016. Summary of points raised:

- Premier Illawarra has been engaged by Transport for NSW to collect passengers wishing to disembark from the cruise ship in Port Kembla Harbour. The ship is due to dock at 7am with passengers disembarking at 8am.
- Numbers of passengers disembarking will depend on weather and the desire to engage in various on shore activities. There are six planned tours to various destinations including The Seacliff Bridge, the Highlands and the South Coast. The Ship to City Shuttle will relay disembarking passengers and deliver them to the CBD for connection with other services or simply to sight see in the local area.
- Traffic Control will be in place and the Gong Shuttle is set to run every 10 minutes on Cruise Ship days.
- There will be a meeting with Premier and Destination Wollongong in July to discuss logistics. One suggestion is that the car park at Marine Drive be utilised for 'Buses Only' on the Sunday's where cruise ships are in town.
- The second cruise ship is due to visit on a Tuesday and further discussions will need to be held to discuss how to facilitate this in light of school services and workforce traffic.




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


Attachment 2 – Coastal Classic Trail Run – 2 of 5






Attachment 2 – Coastal Classic Trail Run – 3 of 5



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


Attachment 2 – Coastal Classic Trail Run – 4 of 5







Attachment 2 – Coastal Classic Trail Run – 5 of 5






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
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Attachment 3 - Bravo Challenge - 2 of 5






Attachment 3 - Bravo Challenge - 3 of 5

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



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
Attachment 5 - Design - Fairy Meadow Bus Zone
