ABOUT WOLLONGONG 2022

In 2011, Wollongong City Council started to talk to the community about developing a community plan to make Wollongong the best place it can be. This plan is called Wollongong 2022: Community Strategic Plan. It has a vision for the future of Wollongong and six community goals which will help reach this vision.

The whole community has an important role to play in making Wollongong 2022 a reality. This means you, your family and friends, schools and other places of learning, Council and other government agencies, businesses and community groups.

CREATING WOLLONGONG 2022

To develop this plan, Wollongong City Council asked children and young people:

- What they like most about living in Wollongong
- What things worry them most about living in Wollongong
- What things they would change to make Wollongong a better place to live
- If Wollongong was the very best place to live, what would it look and feel like?

Some children and young people answered a survey, others talked to Council staff and they wrote down their thoughts or recorded them on a digital recorder, while others drew pictures to share what they were thinking about these questions.

This information, along with information from other community members, was used to develop the Wollongong 2022 vision and community goals.


THE CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE OF WOLLONGONG TOLD US

- It is a friendly, caring place to live
- People interact with each other, their city and community
- There is a strong sense of community
- There is better communication between the community and government

To make this happen we need to:

- Increase our sense of community by connecting neighbourhoods through activities, programs and projects
- Encourage residents to have their say by providing more engagement opportunities
- Encourage the community to take an active role in decisions that affect our city
- Use social media for engagement with the community
- Create diverse intergenerational projects and programs across the city

- Listen to the stories older people tell you and ask them questions
- Share your community spirit with others
- Find out about Council, what it does, how you can contribute to decisions and tell Council what you think

Our community is safe, healthy and happy, and we belong. We enjoy the relaxed pace, being with family and friends, helping our neighbours and meeting new people. There are lots of different recreation and play activities. We encourage everyone to keep learning and share a common goal to make Wollongong a better place for us all. Our basic needs are met and our quality of life improves.

The children and young people of Wollongong told us:

Wollongong would be a better/ the best place to live, if:

- We feel safe and there is less crime and graffiti
- The people are happy
- Parks, sports fields and recreation areas are well looked after
- · There are more houses for people who don't have a home and houses are affordable

To make this happen we need to:

- Improve community safety through crime prevention
- Develop projects that help community members experience personal happiness
- . Make sure our public places and facilities are kept clean by reducing litter and graffiti
- Provide a variety of public spaces and opportunities for sport, leisure, recreation, learning and cultural activities
- Improve access to different types of affordable housing for residents and provide services for those in urgent need of shelter

WE HAVE SUSTAINABLE, AFFORDABLE AND ACCESSIBLE TRANSPORT

There will be a skate park and a giant playground for adults. (Crirl, aged 12, Port Kembla)

We have a transport system of buses, trains and cycleways that all work together and are easy to use and affordable. We can get from the north to south and east to west of Wollongong using this transport. Our footpaths and cycle ways are safe and connect to each other so people can choose to walk, cycle, skate or scooter around Wollongong. We are linked to other places like Sydney and Canberra so you can travel easily and safely.

The children and young people of Wollongong told us:

Wollongong would be a better/ the best place to live, if:

- The free Gong shuttle bus extended its route to other suburbs of Wollongong
- Public transport is better
- We have a fast train to Sydney and we had an airport
- Our cycle ways are extended

To make this happen we need to:

- Extend the service of the free Gong shuttle bus
- Create a bike friendly city
- Improve train services and stations across our area
- Reduce travel time between Sydney and Wollongong
- Improve late night transport

- Use public transport regularly
