- Can you add a vertical garden or even create a rooftop garden?

Why not replace the grass on the verge in front of your house with plants to create a mixed produce, water-wise, native, low maintenance, coastal or sensory garden?

Did you know, suburbs of Wollongong have some of the lowest tree canopy cover in NSW?

We're adding more plants and trees across our city and caring for the ones we already have through our Urban Greening Program.

We want to increase average canopy cover from the current 17% up to our goal of 35-40%.

Because plants and trees cool our towns and cities, reduce pollution and attract investment. They also make us healthier, happier and more productive.
