BACKGROUND

1 Corrimal Augusta Street – Ward 1 (Item 3.1 of Wollongong Traffic Committee Minutes of Meeting) Christmas Party - Augusta Street – Closure 17 October 2020

Background

Council has received a request from the Corrimal Community Church to hold their annual Christmas Carols between 4 pm and 9 pm on Sunday 13 December 2020. The Church has provided evidence from adjoining residents that there is no objection to the road closure taking place. The applicant has indicated that they have space for 20 people in accordance with NSW Health current regulations and has indicated that residents may also participate from their own properties.

Detour signs are required on both approaches to the intersection at Pioneer Road and Augusta Street and vehicle mitigation on Council's Traffic Management Plan be located 15m west of Pioneer Road with the barriers at the intersection.

Consultation

Consultation with the community is required as a condition of approval for this road closure.

Proposal Supported Unanimously

The proposed road closure is approved subject to a closure sign at the entrance point to Augusta Street on Pioneer Road and Council's <u>Standard Conditions for Street Parties</u>.

Applicants for proposed events must comply with current <u>Public Health Orders and restrictions</u>. In addition to this, NSW Police require a formal application for an event which is a Public Assembly (that is, an event in a public place). An application will need to be lodged firstly with the Local Area Command prior to being considered by the Assistant Commissioner. It is anticipated that this process has a minimum lead-time of 6-8 week to receive a response.

A Public Assembly is defined in the NSW Summary Offences Act and has no minimum numbers limit.

The Public Health Orders apply to private and public spaces.

2 Wollongong Endeavour Drive (Item 3.2 of Wollongong Traffic Committee Minutes of Meeting)

Illawarra Cycle Club, Endeavour Drive Criterium Series - Road Closures 2020/21

Background

Illawarra Cycle Club proposes holding a series of criterium races on the following Sundays:

- 29 November 2020:
- 27 June 2021;
- 29 August 2021; and
- 28 November 2021

The closure of Endeavour Drive will take effect from 6 am to permit preparation of the event and the road will be opened by 12.30 pm on each day.

Traffic control details have been provided with road closures and vehicle mitigation at the entrance to Endeavour Drive. The Traffic Management Plans also include management of the one-way access into the Wollongong Harbour and the organisers will need to consult with the Harbour business and the NSW Department of Lands to permit traffic management on private land.

Consultation

Consultation with landowners is required as a condition of approval for this road closure.

Proposal Supported Unanimously

The proposed road closure is approved subject to submitted Traffic Management Plans, Department of Lands approval and Council's <u>Standard Conditions for Road Closures</u>.

Applicants for proposed events must comply with current <u>Public Health Orders and restrictions</u>. In addition to this, NSW Police require a formal application for an event which is a Public Assembly (that is, an event in a public place). An application will need to be lodged firstly with the Local Area Command prior to being considered by the Assistant Commissioner. It is anticipated that this process has a minimum lead-time of 6-8 week to receive a response.

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The Public Health Orders apply to private and public spaces.

3 Mount Keira Mount Keira Road and Harry Graham Drive – Ward 2 (Item 3.3 of Wollongong Traffic Committee Minutes of Meeting)
Illawarra Cycle Club, Mount Keira Road and Harry Graham Drive – Road Closures

Background

The Illawarra Cycle Club have proposed road closures on Mount Keira Road and Harry Graham Drive Mount Keira to permit a monthly series of Club road races, to be held on the second Saturday each month. Approval is requested for the closure of the section of Mount Keira Road between Clive Bissell Drive and Picton Road, and on Harry Graham Drive between Mount Keira Road and Fire Trail 15B (near the non-operational coal conveyor at O'Brien's Drift).

The closures are to take effect from 1 pm until 5 pm for the second Saturday of each month from 11 October 2020 to 11 December 2021. The club are planning to use days where the Mount Kembla Motorcycle facility will not have regular events. Residents and other landowners will be able to access their sites via Cordeaux Road and Harry Graham Drive at Mount Kembla during the closures. For through drivers the alternate route will be via Mount Ousley Road, Clive Bissell Drive and Mount Keira Road east of Clive Bissell Drive.

Consultation

Consultation with the affected parts of the community is a condition of approval.



Proposal Supported Unanimously

The proposed road closures of Harry Graham Drive and Mount Keira Road be approved subject to submitted Traffic Management Plans to include vehicle mitigation and Council's <u>Standard Conditions for Road Closures</u>.

Applicants for proposed events must comply with current <u>Public Health Orders and restrictions</u>. In addition to this, NSW Police require a formal application for an event which is a Public Assembly (that is, an event in a public place). An application will need to be lodged firstly with the Local Area Command prior to being considered by the Assistant Commissioner. It is anticipated that this process has a minimum lead-time of 6-8 week to receive a response.

A Public Assembly is defined in the NSW Summary Offences Act and has no minimum numbers limit.

The Public Health Orders apply to private and public spaces.

4 Port Kembla Gloucester Boulevard – Ward 3 (Item 3.4 of Wollongong Traffic Committee Minutes of Meeting) Illawarra Triathlon Event Series – Gloucester Boulevard Road Closures 2020/21

Background

The Illawarra Triathlon Club are holding their 2020/21 race series on Gloucester Boulevard as in previous years. The events involve running and cycle sections during Winter with the addition of the swim section in the warmer months. The road closure only involves the cycling and residents and other visitors are permitted to pass through between cycling races.

The road closures take effect from 6.30 am and 11.30 am on each of the Sundays set out below:

- 6 September 2020;
- 11 October 2020;
- 26 October 2020;
- 8 November 2020;
- 13 December 2020;
- 24 January 2021;
- 21 February 2021; and
- 14 March 2021

The closures have minimal effect on residents in the area immediately south of the event course. Other visitors to the beach at the northern end of Gloucester Boulevard have access via Darcy Road.

Consultation

Consultation with residents and other stakeholders is a condition of approval.

Proposal Supported Unanimously

The road closures for Gloucester Boulevard, Port Kembla to permit the above triathlon race series be approved subject to the submitted Traffic Management Plans to include vehicle mitigation and Council's <u>Standard Conditions for Road Closures</u>.

Applicants for proposed events must comply with current <u>Public Health Orders and restrictions</u>. In addition to this, NSW Police require a formal application for an event which is a Public Assembly (that is, an event in a public place). An application will need to be lodged firstly with the Local Area Command prior to being considered by the Assistant Commissioner. It is anticipated that this process has a minimum lead-time of 6-8 week to receive a response.

A Public Assembly is defined in the NSW Summary Offences Act and has no minimum numbers limit. The Public Health Orders apply to private and public spaces.

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


























AREA MAP
